

### About KIPP KC


KIPP KC is a part of a national network of non-profit, college-preparatory, public charter schools educating elementary, middle, and high school students. Since opening our doors in 2013, KIPP KC's enrollment has increased from 120 students to over 600 (and counting!).

### KIPP Through College


Deciding which college to attend is one of the most important decisions a student will make on the journey toward graduation. KIPP Through College (KTC) is a part of the broader KIPP approach that helps to eliminate the opportunity gap between students from high- and low-income communities. KTC helps bridge the transition from high school to college by working with KIPP students and families to identify, apply to, and enroll in a college that is a strong match academically, socially, and financially in order to set them up for on-time graduation.

In areas where there are no KIPP high schools, KTC helps KIPP students identify and apply to college-preparatory high schools and stays connected with students and alumni, offering supports such as ACT/SAT prep classes, counseling, and academic advisement.


## PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS WHO GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL




Low-Income

### Ensuring KIPP students stay on the journey *To and Through College*


To persist and graduate, alumni must have early and ongoing academic success, be able to cover the cost of college, network with peers, and navigate the college system and campus. KTC supports persistence by providing college and career coaching to all college-age alumni. We help students integrate socially and academically during college and understand and navigate the financial hurdles that they must face on the path to graduation. At KTC KC, we work to build a cohort of alumni, provide peer-to-peer support and connect students to college resources and staff. Comprehensive support systems like these help our students gain the essential skills necessary to succeed in the competitive world after college.

### KIPP KC's Impact


A college degree is an essential stepping-stone to rewarding work, a steady income, self-sufficiency, and life success. On average, college graduates earn more, vote more, volunteer more, enjoy greater job security, are healthier, and use public assistance less than people without a college degree. However, approximately 10 percent of low-income students actually complete college, while the other 90 percent of low-income students in our country start their adult lives with substantially limited opportunities, lower earning potential, and less freedom to determine their futures.

We're working hard every day to increase the opportunity low-income students have to pursue their dreams...and its working! KIPP national and KIPP KC alumni graduate college at a rate four times higher than the low-income average.


## PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS WHO COMPLETE FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE




Low-Income
